1. (3 points) Find the exact value (not a decimal approximation) of each limit.

(a) $\lim_{x \rightarrow -2} (4x^2 - 5x + 7)$

(b) $\lim_{x \rightarrow \pi/3} (\sqrt{3x} \sin x)$

2. (4 points) Suppose that you are given the following information:

$$f(3) = 8, \quad \lim_{x \rightarrow 3} f(x) = -5, \quad g(3) = 0, \quad \lim_{x \rightarrow 3} g(x) = 4.$$

Find each limit. Carefully show how you are using the limit laws.

(a) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 3} [6f(x) - 2g(x)]$

(b) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 3} \left(\frac{x^2 f(x)}{g(x)} \right)$

3. (3 points) Explain why neither the limit laws nor direct substitution can be used to evaluate each limit.

(a) $\lim_{x \rightarrow \pi/2} \left(\frac{\tan x}{\sin x} \right)$

(b) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 1} \sqrt{1 - x^2}$

(c) $\lim_{x \rightarrow 0} \left(\frac{\sqrt[3]{x}}{\sin x} \right)$
